# Peanut Butter (or Cheese) Sandwiches

### MATERIALS:

Milkbones

Peanut butter/ Spray cheese

Brown paper bags

Tongue depressor

#### DIRECTIONS:

Use the tongue depressor to spread a layer of peanut butter (or spray cheese) on one Milkbone. Use a quarter of an inch layer of peanut butter or less. (We don't want any dog stomachaches)

Next, place a second Milkbone on top to create a sandwich.

Repeat steps 1 and 2 so you have two peanut butter sandwiches.

Put two peanut butter sandwiches into one brown paper bag. Fold/roll the bag down.

# Milkbone "Candies"

### MATERIALS:

Milkbones (any size you would like) \*Even cutting a large one in half works!

Tissue paper

Tape (if necessary)

Ruler

Scissors

### **DIRECTIONS:**

Lay the milkbone on the tissue paper and cut at least 3 inches bigger than it (usually roughly a 7 inch by 7 inch square works).

Wrap the tissue square around a large milk bone and twist the ends.



If necessary, to hold the center of the wrapping down, place a piece of tape.

Repeat!
