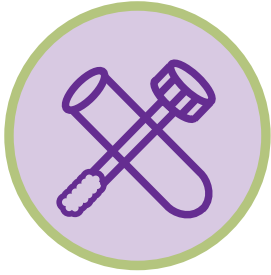
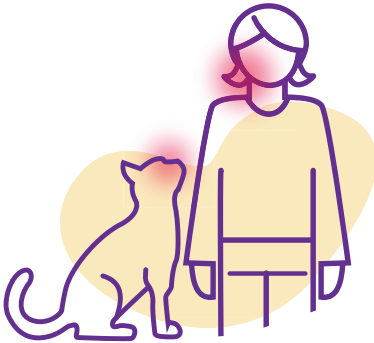


A Guide for Your Pet and Covid-19



Should I test my pet for Covid-19?

NO. Neither the CDC, USDA, AVMA nor CVMA recommends that companion animals be routinely tested for Covid-19.



Can pets transmit Covid-19 to people?

Currently, there is no evidence that animals can transmit the virus to people.

Human to animal transmissions are believed to be rare.



If my pet is sick and I think it's Covid-19, what should I do?

If your pet gets sick after contact with a person with Covid-19, do not take your pet to the veterinary clinic yourself. Call your veterinarian to determine the next steps for your pet's treatment and care.



Is there a treatment for pets infected with Covid-19?

There is no specific treatment for animals diagnosed with Covid-19 infection, so testing will not alter clinical management.



Can my veterinarian test my pet if I ask them to?

Veterinarians are strongly encouraged to rule out other, more common causes of illness in animals before considering Covid-19 testing.
