Patients that have this surgery do not have any sutures that need to be removed. The eye itself needs to be medicated with antibiotics for up to 2 weeks.

Occasionally this condition can recur due to the size of the gland, the shape of the cartilage, and the difficulty of getting it to remain in the pocket that was created. If it does recur the next surgical option is usually to remove the tear gland and cartilage. This method, known as a salvage method, is not preferred because it has been reported to cause dry eye from poor tear production, which can be a costly condition to maintain to keep the eye healthy and comfortable. If the eye cannot be repaired by the first surgical intervention, cherry eye is largely a cosmetic issue that may be preferable to dry eye.
