

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Common Issues







Being mouthy

Becoming overstimulated

Trying to escape or getting loose



Working with adult cats in cages



More challenging for several reasons

Fewer places for the cat to hide

More intrusive to cats

Easier for cats to escape



Successful Visits in Uptown & Downtown



Remember our goal is to calm and relax the cats



Use slow, one handed petting



Keep the cats in their space, not in your arms or on the floor



Pay close attention to the cat's body language. Avoid the belly of cats!!



Clean towels & sanitize hands between visit



Loose Animals

Prevention is key!

Do NOT try to catch the animal or get them back in their cage

Yell "loose cat!"

Try to watch where the animal goes (without chasing them)







Documenting your visit

Every volunteer makes notes about a cat each time they visit



Read those notes before visiting to become away of any potential challenges



Document what date/time you visited the cat, and make notes about the visit





Room at a Glance vs. Individual Cat Pages


Room at a Glance

- Look for your cat's name and if there is no name in the "volunteer" spot, write your name, start and stop time there first. If a name is already filled in, you can just go to the Individual Cat Page.

Entering and Exiting Cages & Rooms

Use your body as a barrier

Use food or toys as a distraction

Don't be afraid to ask for help!







Help our cats be the best!

Our goal is to help them stay calm and relaxed

Discourage rough play

Use calm, gentle petting

Respond to their cues and body language





Let's go visit the cats!







Reminders



Kittens in kitten room or lobby



Adult cats in glass rooms, Uptown/Dowtown with "JV Approved" card



Kittens first, then adult cats



No "I have a cold" card, no "I just had surgery or sedation" cards



Reminders



You may only volunteer for what you sign up for

You may not assist with customer visitation

You may not bring friends or family members with you when you volunteer

You should only plan on staying for your assigned shift
